
- Purpose: Collect the views of horseowners on how they feel about horse ID







### Overall, how well do you think the current horse passport system is working?









Nightmare. If they want people to keep them updated, make it easier to do!"


"There seem to be too many loopholes which make it easy for the unscrupulous to mislead"

"I've found it to work reasonably well"


"I have only had to update one of my horse passports, and in my case the process was relatively quick and easy"




# Enforcement of Equine ID: why is it important?


Equine ID is fundamental to the enforceability of the majority of equine legislation


