The power of horses: equestrianism's social value

- The study focused on three categories of engagement:
 - on-the-horse participation
 - off-the-horse engagement
 - volunteering.
- These are assessed for two primary outcomes:
 - Primary benefits: Improvements in individual life satisfaction, valued via WELLBY.
 - Secondary benefits: Cost savings to the NHS.
- Launched October 2025 at Saddlers' Hall.
- Phase 2 'Securing a bright future' advocacy piece of work - going to tender for a partner in early 2026
- Riding for the Disabled's Impact Report launched last week.





The WELLBY figures

It is estimated that 25% of this total value comes through riding schools.

That's a value of £292,000 per riding school.
