Research (HBLB)



The Veterinary Advisory Committee is currently reviewing this year's applications:

- 17 for major research projects
- 14 for small research projects
- 4 for post doctoral fellowships
- 11 for research scholarships
- 3 for clinical scholarships

This is the largest total for around 10 years.

Unknown what the HBLB's veterinary budget allocation will be, or what partner funders might be inclined to support, so we cannot yet predict how many of the applications will be funded.

Besides the various grants, HBLB also funds equine surveillance (with racehorse owners and breeders), the Codes of Practice, and conference support.
